Prior to planting, the property owner shall contact Sarasota County to schedule a site inspection to review planting plans, schematics, and expectations associated with this restoration plan. Sarasota County has the sole authority to allow minor adjustments to the schematic and spacing requirements based on field conditions.

Within 10 days of completing the plantings, the property owner shall contact Sarasota County to schedule an inspection to confirm the installation of plantings in accordance with the approved plan. Upon inspection, the County may require the relocation of plantings if they have not been installed in a location meeting appropriate shoreline elevation conditions for their success.

All vegetation to be installed shall be of nursery stock.

Maintenance

All nuisance and invasive plant species including, but not limited to Australian pine (*Casuarina* spp.), Brazilian pepper (*Schinus terebinthifolius*), beach naupaka (*Scaevola taccada or sericea*), Senegal date palm (*Phoenix reclinata*), carrotwood (*Cupaniopsis anacardioides*), creeping ox-eye (*Wedelia trilobata*), Chinese tallow (*Sapium sebiferum*), and punk tree (*Melaleuca quinquenervia*) shall be removed from the preserve area of the property. All nuisance and invasive trees shall be stump cut, properly treated and removed by hand. This area shall be maintained free of these species and any re-growth shall be
